Last years' events

ERS volunteers spend tremendous amount of time helping victims in various ways. Being an integral part of IAN, which is an umbrella organization representing all Indians living in Nebraska, we work closely with all local and regional Indian Associations including student associations.

Last year we helped one consultants family, when they were faced his untimely demise. His family located in Denver was unaware of his situation. ERS volunteers worked with his wife providing immediate psychological comfort and with authorities to ensure everything proceeded smoothly.

There was another incident with a medical emergency. We worked with the government authorities in helping the persons parents come here and help with his long-term care. ERS and many community members volunteered time and other help to help the parents get settled in.

During the fire in Hillsborough apartments last year, two families were affected. ERS worked to help them find shelter and help with their other needs.

These efforts are not possible without funds. To this end IAN organized an Odissi dance program. The dancers very magnanimously donated all proceeds to the ERS.

The students of UNO organized a sweet sale, where they made laddoos and sold it. The money raised by them was also donated to the ERS. It is heartwarming to see the next generation step up to a good cause.

All of us recognize the problems with living so far away from India. When you are faced with difficult times ERS will be the family or friend that you need and stand by you to offer help in any way that we can.

Spotlight:

STATE: Karnataka

Karnataka is situated in the southwestern part of India. It is the eighth largest state by area and ninth largest by population. It has two major rivers — Krishna and Kaveri run across the state. Karnataka is bordered by Goa and Maharashtra to the north, Andhra Pradesh to the east, Kerala and Tamil Nadu to the south and the Arabian Sea on the west.



Bangalore is its largest city and capital. Other large cities include Hubli, Mysore, and Mangalore. Kannada is the most widely spoken and official language. While majority of the workforce is in agriculture, Karnataka is the manufacturing hub for some of the largest public sector industries like Hindustan Aeronautics limited (HAL), Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) and the center for many premier science and technology research centers like Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Bharat Electronics limited (BEL), Indian Institute of Science (IISc) and Central Food Technological Research Institute (CFTRI). With the surge of Information Technology (IT), Bangalore has earned the title of Silicon Valley of India.

Many festivals are celebrated here like Ugadi (New Year), Makara Sankranti (Harvest festival), Ganesh Chaturthi, Basava Jayanthi (for the famed lingayat Basava). Rajyotsava day is celebrated to mark the anniversary of the formation of the state on Nov 1st. Dasara is celebrated with much gusto in Mysore.









The diverse linguistic and religious ethnicities native to Karnataka have contributed to the immensely varied cultural heritage. Yakshagana is a classical dance drama and one of the major theatrical forms of Karnataka. Some noted musicians are – Bhimsen Joshi, Hindustani vocalist and Purandaradasa, the grandfather of Carnatic music.

By virtue of its varied geography and long history Karnataka has numerous tourist interest spots ranging from ancient sculptured temples, scenic hills and endless beaches. The Gol Gumbaz in Bijapur is the second largest pre-modern dome in the world. Jog falls in Shimoga is India's tallest single-tiered waterfall.







Rice and ragi are staple foods. Some of the dishes that are popular are Bisibele bath (hot lentil rice), Ragi mudde (finger millet balls), Uppittu (roasted semolina porridge), Dosa and Mysore pak (gram flour sweet). The Udipi cuisine from coastal Karnataka is also very popular all over India.
