Spotlight:

STATE: Rajasthan

Rajasthan is situated in the north-western part of India. It is India's largest state by area and eighth largest by population. Rajasthan means "the land of kings". Rajasthan is dominanted by the inhospitable Thar desert. It is bordered by Punjab and Haryana to the north, Pakistan to the west, Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh to the south and Uttar Pradesh to the east.



Jaipur, is both its capital and largest city. Some of the other large cities in Rajasthan are Jodhpur, Kota, Bikaner, Ajmer and Udaipur. Hindi is the primary language, while Rajasthani and Punjabi are also spoken by a minority. Some well-known personalities who hail from Rajasthan include business magnates like Birla, Mittlas, and Bajajs, famed mathematician Brahmagupta ghazal singer Jagjit Singh, Hindu mystic poet Mirabai and Maha Rana Pratap Singh. Agriculture is the primary industry. Rajasthan is the largest producer of edible oils in India and the second largest producer of polyester fiber.



The main religious festivals are Depawali, Holi, Gangaur (worship of Gauri) and Sankranthi (harvest festival) as Hinduism is the main religion. A desert festival is held during winter and celebrated with lots of color, dancing and singing

Rajasthan is culturally rich and the traditions reflect the ancient way of life. The Ghoomar and Kalbeliya dances have gained international recognition. Folk music and Kathputli (string puppets) are also a vital part of the culture. Bright colored attire with mirror and embroidery work symbolizes the vibrant state.





Some note-worthy places to visit include the ruins of the Indus Valley civilization at Kalibangan, the Dilwara Temples at Mount Abu, the Jantar Mantar, the Hawa Mahal and sand stone houses in Jaipur, the forts in Jaisalmer and Keoladeo National Park near Bharatpur (bird sanctuary). It is also home to two national tiger reserves Ranthambhore in Sawi and Sariska in Alwar.

Rajasthani cuisine is influenced by the war-like lifestyle and arid conditions. Dal (lentil curry) - Bati (baked balls of wheat dough) - Churma (sweet) is a very popular dish. Bikaneri Bhujia (crispy gram flour starter), Mirchi bada (chili cutlet) and Ghevar (sweet) are popular snacks.

- -There will be **No Repetition** of songs, to provide variety to the audience.
- -In order to give opportunity to all enthusiastic participants, each participant can perform not more than two items.
